HAVE YOUR SAY ON EAST YORKSHIRE DEVOLUTION DEAL

East Riding of Yorkshire Council, Hull City Council and the Government have now agreed a proposed devolution deal for our area.

If implemented, the deal, which was revealed in Chancellor Jeremy Hunt's autumn statement, would lead to the creation of a Hull and East Yorkshire Mayoral Combined Authority (MCA), led by a directly elected mayor, who could be elected in May 2025.

The MCA would have powers to invest in areas such as transport, skills and housing, as well an additional £400m of devolved funding over the next 30 years to invest in local priorities.

The proposed deal will be considered by both local authorities' full council meetings in December. Subject to councillors' approval, a public consultation will follow in January, giving residents the chance to voice their opinions on each part of the deal.

Councillor Anne Handley, leader of East Riding of Yorkshire Council urged everyone to engage in the consultation.

"With a £400 million investment fund and new powers in key areas like transport, housing and adult education, this deal offers us a seat at the top table and the opportunity to truly level up our region," said Cllr Handley. "Our focus is and always will be what matters to our residents, and I encourage everyone to get involved and take part in the upcoming public consultation. This is our chance to shape the future of East Yorkshire."

HELPING HEDGEHOGS IN BRIDLINGTON



Hedgehogs are in decline, and they need our help!

It is still possible to occasionally see a hedgehog out and about during winter, but if it is a small one it will most likely need help. To request help for a hedgehog in this area please message/contact Jo on 07717552624 or Ruth on 07941314459.

The Town Council have Hedgehog links for gardens so that they can move around more easily and can be fitted into existing fencing. They are £3 per Hedgehogs R us Highway Surround and available from the Town Councils Offices.

Other ways to help hedgehogs are:

- To make sure that all holes and drains are safe as they can fall down and not be able to get out.
 - Create a wild corner in the garden so that they can hibernate or nest there.
 - Removing anything from the garden that they could get tangled in.
- If you have a regular visitor to your garden you can put out meaty cat or dog food but NOT mealworms, peanuts, suet or milk.
- Reduce lawn treatments as they remove natural hedgehog food sources. Check before strimming the garden in Springtime.
 - Make a hedgehog home or get a feeding station.
